ADMINISTRATIVE BUSINESS:

The Purchase Order has been sent to Len Adduono, Adduono Property Services for the snowplowing contract.

ONGOING BUSINESS:

Fire Chief Johnson provided an update on the fire department. The department has responded to a few calls since the beginning of October. The department had interesting call from Kashabowie that Fire Chief Johnson refused, since they are well outside of our service area. Tracey Johnson, fire chief, and Richard Baxter attended the scene in their personal vehicle and informed the people that they do not have fire service. She also advised them that the Shebandowan LSB would not entertain the idea of expanding their service area to include Kashabowie, unless they could come up with a plan that included the required volunteers. Wayne Scott pointed out that the OFM would not allow us to expand our boundaries without a lot more volunteers. Also, the process to expand the boundaries takes approximately 3 years to approve.

Wayne Scott received a phone call about signage on Whiskey Jack Road indicating that a driveway had been moved, and new signage may be required. He and David Harris drove to the section of road and have replaced the necessary signage.
